Voice Study Centre: Monitoring and Auditing Policy

1. Purpose:

This policy establishes the framework for monitoring and auditing research activities conducted at the Voice Study Centre. The purpose is to:

- Ensure adherence to ethical principles, legal requirements, and institutional policies.
- Verify the accuracy and reliability of research data.
- Identify and mitigate potential risks.

2. Scope:

Monitors and Auditors:

- o Document findings accurately and completely.

9. Review and Updates:
